

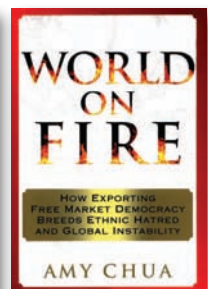
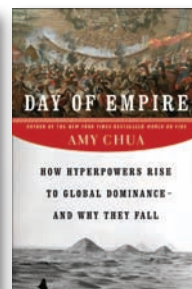
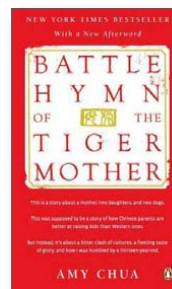

Amy was named one of The 2011 *Time* 100's Most Influential People – and photographed with two *live* tigers.

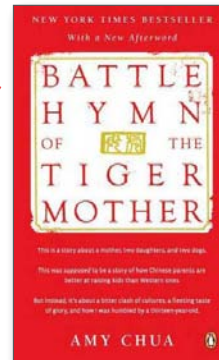

S. from the Philippines, Amy chronicles her iron-willed decision to raise her daughters her way—the Chinese way—and the remarkable results her choices inspires. An awe-inspiring, often hilarious, and unerringly honest story of one mother's exercise in extreme parenting, revealing the rewards—and the costs—of raising her children the Chinese way.
